

METER PARKING PERMIT FOR RIVIERA VILLAGE - THE PIER - BEACH

For the convenience of drivers who frequently use the Riviera Village shopping area, the Pier, or the beach, meter parking permits are available. This permit allows you to park at a meter for the length of the meter for free. Meter permits are purchased at the License & Collections Division, City Hall, from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (**closed** every other Friday). The meter permit is non-transferable, one permit per vehicle.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU BREAK A LAW?

You can receive a *Notice of Parking Violation* and be liable for a penalty payment. Your vehicle could be towed away at your expense.

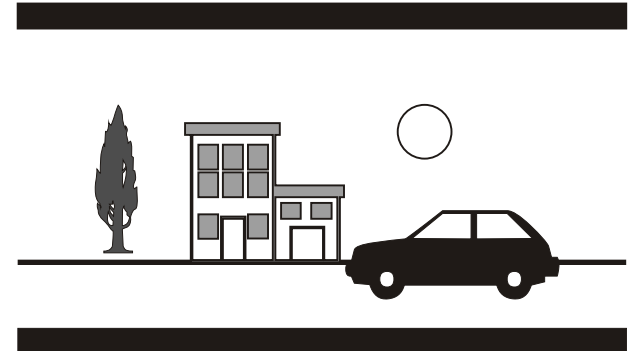
If you have five or more outstanding parking violations, or if the vehicle is parked so as to endanger public safety, the vehicle will be towed.

If your vehicle has been towed, contact the Redondo Beach Police Department at (310) 379-2477.

If you think that you were unfairly noticed of violation, or that your vehicle was unfairly impounded, you can contest the action by requesting an *Administrative Investigation* within 21 days of the issuance of the notice of violation or within 14 days of the mailing of the notice of delinquent parking violation.

We hope that you will always find a convenient parking space.

WELCOME TO REDONDO BEACH

Redondo Beach is primarily a residential and recreational community. The City is 6.2 square miles of land area with approximately 65,000 people who live here year-round. We offer many excellent recreational facilities such as King Harbor (a 1,000 slip private-craft port), the Pier, Seaside Lagoon, a variety of parks, a performing arts auditorium, a bathing and surfing beach, The Galleria (a large indoor shopping mall), a specialty shopping area known as Riviera Village, and we are home to leading industrial firms, such as TRW, Inc. We are a diversified community with an effective parking enforcement program to protect and fairly appropriate scarce parking space for all legitimate users. We have parking rules.

We have tried to be fair to everyone in writing our parking rules. We believe we have been. And we think it is fair to warn you that our parking rules are strictly enforced.

First we will tell you where **not** to park. That way, you can avoid the inconvenience and expense of being given a notice of parking violation or having your vehicle towed at your expense.

WHERE NOT TO PARK

- **In alleys.** Only vehicles may park for loading and unloading of persons or materials.
- **Any place** where **NO PARKING** signs are posted. (Commercial vehicles may park just long enough to make pickups or deliveries at a location where a building permit has previously been obtained.)
- **Where you block any driveway**, either by being in it or in front of it.
- **In posted NO PARKING - TOW AWAY areas.** Your vehicle could be issued a notice of parking violation and towed at your expense.

- **On the sidewalk or on the parkway area** (usually grass or brick) between the sidewalk and curb. **Note:** when you are parked in your own driveway make sure your vehicle does not block the sidewalk. You must leave unobstructed clearance for pedestrians, or your vehicle can be issued a notice of violation.
- **In disabled spaces**, unless your vehicle displays a *disabled person* license or an official placard. These spaces are marked with **blue paint** on the curb or edge of the paved portion of the street and by signs. Do not park on the lines marking the boundaries of a disabled parking stall or space.
- **In red zones**, ever. Pay careful attention to the paint on the curb.
- **In yellow zones**, except for loading and unloading - **3 minute** limit, enforced Monday through Saturday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- **In white zones**, except for the loading and unloading of passengers (3 minute limit) or depositing mail in mailboxes.
- **Commercial vehicles** having a laden weight of 6,000 pounds or more or having a "*manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating*" of 10,000 pounds or more **cannot** park in residential districts.
- **At pedestrian crosswalks** marked or unmarked. Pedestrians are to be able to cross the street without obstruction to the opposite side.
- **Trailer or semi-trailer.** Unattached trailers are allowed up to two hours to load and unload, otherwise all trailers **must** be attached to a vehicle capable of moving the trailer or semitrailer in a normal manner.
- **In posted** preferential parking zones where permits are required, unless you have the authorized permit.
- **A vehicle** with expired registration tabs on any public street, highway, or alley.

- **In the same place** for more than 72 hours without moving.
- **Upon any public** street, highway or alley to repair, or make any repair, or add or install any part or accessory to any vehicle.

WHERE TO PARK

- **At meters** (when paid, **excluding disabled**), except during hours specified "**NO PARKING.**"
- **In one and two hour zones** between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. everyday.
- **In green zones**, but only for 15 minutes between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. everyday.
- **In preferential** parking zones with permit.

NOTE: Vehicles displaying the disabled special identification license plate or distinguishing placard may park in the above areas without concern.

PREFERENTIAL PARKING ZONES

The City has residential preferential parking zones where permits are required for the parking of vehicles during posted days and hours. Residents may purchase two permanent and two guest preferential parking permits per household annually. For special events, one day only preferential parking permits may be purchased.

All preferential parking permits are purchased at the Parking Enforcement Unit located at Door E in City Hall.

NOTE: The preferential parking permit does **not** allow a vehicle to be parked during the days and hours posted "**NO PARKING**", nor can anyone park for more than 72 hours in one place.
