

	<p>Alborough, Jez. Where's My Teddy? (PIC ALBOROUG)</p> <p>When a small boy named Eddie goes searching for his lost teddy in the dark woods, he comes across a gigantic bear with a similar problem.</p>
	<p>Alike. All By Myself (PIC ALIKI)</p> <p>A child shows all the things he has learned to do all on his own.</p>
	<p>Andreae, Giles. Captain Flinn and the Pirate Dinosaurs (PIC GILES)</p> <p>When Flinn enters the classroom art closet for supplies, his imagination sends him on a high-seas adventure filled with pirates, dinosaurs, mystery, and swordfights.</p>
	<p>Arnold, Tedd. No Jumping on the Bed (PIC ARNOLD)</p> <p>Walter lives near the top floor of a tall apartment building, where one night his habit of jumping on his bed leads to a tumultuous fall through floor after floor, collecting occupants all the way down.</p>
	<p>Asch, Frank. Happy Birthday Moon (EASY ASCH)</p> <p>When a bear discovers that the Moon shares his birthday, he buys the Moon a beautiful hat as a present.</p>
	<p>Asch, Frank. Just Like Daddy (PIC ASCH)</p> <p>A very young bear describes all the activities he does during the day that are just like his daddy's.</p>
	<p>Auch, Mary Jane. Peeping Beauty (PIC AUCH)</p> <p>Poulette the dancing hen falls into the clutches of a hungry fox, who exploits her desire to become a great ballerina.</p>
	<p>Bang, Molly. When Sophie Gets Angry (PIC BANG)</p> <p>When Sophie gets angry, she goes outside and runs, cries, climbs her favorite tree--and then, calmed by the breeze, she is soon ready to go back home.</p>
	<p>Barton, Byron. My Car (PIC BARTON)</p> <p>Sam describes in loving detail his car and how he drives it.</p>
	<p>Beck, Scott. A Mud Pie for Mother (PIC BECK)</p> <p>Little pig, searching for a birthday present for his mother, finds that his kindness to others brings great rewards.</p>




	<p>Broach, Elise. When Dinosaurs Came with Everything (PIC BROACH)</p> <p>Although his mother is a little worried, a young boy is delighted to discover that every shop in town is giving away real dinosaurs to their customers.</p>
	<p>Brown, Margaret Wise. Bumble Bugs and Elephants (PIC BROWN)</p> <p>A colorful book of opposites as big and little animals interact side by side.</p>
	<p>Brown, Margaret Wise. The Golden Egg Book (PIC BROWN)</p> <p>A lonely bunny finds an egg and tries to open it, hoping it contains something fantastic.</p>
	<p>Butler, John. Ten in the Den (PIC BUTLER)</p> <p>One by one nine forest creatures fall out of bed when Little Mouse says "Roll over!"</p>
	<p>Carle, Eric. From Head to Toe (BOARD BOOKS CARLE)</p> <p>Encourages the reader to exercise by following the movements of various animals.</p>
	<p>Carle, Eric. Little Cloud (PIC CARLE)</p> <p>A little cloud becomes all sorts of things--a sheep, an airplane, trees, a hat--before joining other clouds and raining</p>
	<p>Carle, Eric. Very Busy Spider (PIC CARLE)</p> <p>The farm animals try to divert a busy little spider from spinning her web, but she persists and produces a thing of both beauty and usefulness.</p>
	<p>Carle, Eric. Very Clumsy Click Beetle (PIC CARLE)</p> <p>A clumsy young click beetle learns to land on its feet with encouragement from various animals and a wise old beetle. An electronic chip and replaceable batteries create clicking sounds to accompany the story.</p>
	<p>Cousins, Lucy. Maisy Goes to the Library (PIC COUSINS)</p> <p>Maisy goes to the library in search of a book about fish and a quiet place in which to read it.</p>
	<p>Doyle, Charlotte. Supermarket! (PIC DOYLE)</p> <p>A toddler creates chaos while shopping with his mother at the supermarket.</p>

	<p>Feiffer, Jules. Bark, George (PIC FEIFFER)</p> <p>George the puppy's mother is in for a big surprise when she takes him to the veterinarian to find out why he does not bark.</p>
	<p>Flack, Marjorie. The Story About Ping (PIC FLACK)</p> <p>A little duck finds adventure on the Yangtze River when he is too late to board his master's houseboat one evening.</p>
	<p>Fleming, Denise. In the Tall, Tall Grass (PIC FLEMING)</p> <p>Rhymed text (crunch, munch, caterpillars lunch) presents a toddler's view of creatures found in the grass from lunchtime till nightfall, such as bees, ants, and moles.</p>
	<p>Fox, Mem. Hattie and the Fox (PIC FOX)</p> <p>Hattie, a big black hen, discovers a fox in the bushes, which creates varying reactions in the other barnyard animals.</p>
	<p>Fox, Mem. Sleepy Bears (PIC FOX)</p> <p>When winter comes, six sleepy bears are rhymed to sleep by Mother Bear.</p>
	<p>Fox, Mem. Where is the Green Sheep? (PIC FOX)</p> <p>A story about many different sheep, and one that seems to be missing.</p>
	<p>Freeman, Don. Corduroy (PIC FREEMAN)</p> <p>A toy bear in a department store wants a number of things, but when a little girl finally buys him he finds what he has always wanted most of all.</p>
	<p>Gag, Wanda. Millions of Cats (PIC GAG)</p> <p>An old man sets out in search of a pet for his lonely wife and returns with millions of cats, all claiming to be the most beautiful of the bunch.</p>
	<p>Galdone, Paul. The Three Little Pigs (PIC GALDONE)</p> <p>Retells the fatal episodes in the lives of two foolish pigs and how the third pig managed to avoid the same.</p>
	<p>Garland, Michael. Miss Smith Reads Again! (PIC GARLAND)</p> <p>In her out-of-the-ordinary reading class, Miss Smith uses her incredible storybook to transport her students to Arthur Conan Doyle's "The Lost World," where they have an adventure with dinosaurs.</p>
	<p>Geraghty, Paul. Rotten and Rascal (PIC GERAGHTY)</p> <p>The obnoxious squawking of very competitive pterosaur twins Rotten and Rascal gets them into a world of trouble</p>

	<p>Ginsburg, Mirra. (PIC GINSBURG)</p> <p>When he tries to imitate a rooster, a newly-hatched chick falls in a puddle</p>
	<p>Hall, Zoe. The Apple Pie Tree (PIC HALL)</p> <p>Describes an apple tree as it grows leaves and flowers and then produces its fruit, while in its branches robins make a nest, lay eggs, and raise a family. Includes a recipe for apple pie.</p>
	<p>Heidbreder, Robert. Drumheller Dinosaur Dance (PIC HEIDBRED)</p> <p>A boy dreams that at night, the bones of the dinosaurs in Drumheller, Alberta, come alive and dance</p>
	<p>Hillenbrand, Will. Down by the Station (PIC HILLENBR)</p> <p>In this version of a familiar song, baby animals ride to the children's zoo on the zoo train.</p>
	<p>Hutchins, Pat. Good-Night Owl. (PIC HUTCHINS)</p> <p>Because all the other animals' noises keep him from sleeping, Owl watches for a chance to take his revenge</p>
	<p>Hutchins, Pat. Rosie's Walk (PIC HUTCHINS)</p> <p>Although unaware that a fox is after her as she takes a walk around the farmyard, Rosie the hen still manages to lead him into one accident after another.</p>
	<p>Kasza, Keiko. When the Elephant Walks (PIC KASZA)</p> <p>When the Elephant walks he scares the Bear who runs away and scares the Crocodile who runs away and scares the Wild Hog in this never-ending animal story.</p>
	<p>Kasza, Keiko. The Wolf's Chicken Stew (PIC KASZA)</p> <p>A hungry wolf's attempts to fatten a chicken for his stewpot have unexpected results.</p>
	<p>Keats, Ezra. The Snowy Day (PIC KEATS)</p> <p>The adventures of a little boy in the city on a very snowy day</p>
	<p>Kraus, Robert. Leo the Late Bloomer (PIC KRAUS)</p> <p>Leo, a young tiger, finally blooms under the anxious eyes of his parents.</p>
	<p>Leaf, Munro. The Story of Ferdinand (PIC LEAF)</p> <p>Ferdinand likes to sit quietly and smell the flowers, but one day he gets stung by a bee and his snorting and stomping convince everyone that he is the fiercest of bulls.</p>

	<p>Lioni, Leo. Inch by Inch (PIC LIONI)</p> <p>To keep from being eaten, an inchworm measures a robin's tail, a flamingo's neck, a toucan's beak, a heron's legs, and a nightingale's song.</p>
	<p>Lund, Deb. All Aboard the Dinotrain. (PIC LUND)</p> <p>When dinosaurs seek adventure by taking a train ride, they find the trip has some unexpected surprises along the way</p>
	<p>Martin, Bill. Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do You See? (PIC MARTIN)</p> <p>Children see a variety of animals, each one a different color, and a mother looking at them.</p>
	<p>Martin, Bill. Chicka Chicka Boom Boom (PIC MARTIN)</p> <p>An alphabet rhyme/chant that relates what happens when the whole alphabet tries to climb a coconut tree.</p>
	<p>McCarty, Peter. T is for Terrible (PIC MCCARTY)</p> <p>A tyrannosaurus rex explains that he cannot help it that he is enormous and hungry and is not a vegetarian.</p>
	<p>McKee, David. Elmer Again (PIC MCKEE)</p> <p>Elmer, the patchwork elephant, plays an amusing trick on his grey elephant friends.</p>
	<p>Menchin, Scott. Taking a Bath with the Dog and Other Things That Make Me Happy (PIC MENCHIN)</p> <p>In order to answer her mother's question about what would make her smile, a girl first asks various people, animals, and even the moon what makes them happy.so</p>
	<p>Mitton, Tony. Dinosaurumpus! (PIC MOSES)</p> <p>A group of dinosaurs converge upon the swamp where they proceed to romp and stomp until they all fall asleep.</p>
	<p>Park, Linda. Bee-Bim Bop! (PIC PARK)</p> <p>A young girl, eager for a favorite meal, helps her mother with shopping, food preparation, and table setting. Presented in rhyming verse with illustrations</p>
	<p>Raffi. Wheels on the Bus. (PIC RAFFI)</p> <p>Illustrates the children's song "Wheels on the Bus," depicting an ordinary--yet eventful--bus ride through a town in France, and includes the song's score.</p>
	<p>Saltzberg, Barney. I Love Dogs (PIC SALTZBERG)</p> <p>Presents an introduction to dogs, in simple text with illustrations, as a little boy describes the different ways he likes to play with them.</p>

	<p>Seeger, Laura. Lemons Are Not Red (PIC SEEGER)</p> <p>A simple story highlights such things as a yellow lemon, a pink flamingo, and a silver moon in a visual game in which die-cut shapes fall on the correct color backgrounds.</p>
	<p>Shaw, Nancy. Sheep in a Jeep (EASY SHAW)</p> <p>Records the misadventures of a group of sheep that go riding in a jeep.</p>
	<p>Sperring, Mark. Find-a-saurus (PIC SPERRING)</p> <p>Even though Marty's mother has told him that dinosaurs no longer exist, he is certain they are just good at hiding and sets out to find one, encountering many fantastic creatures along the way.</p>
	<p>Steig, William. Sylvester and the Magic Pebble (PIC STEIG)</p> <p>Sylvester the donkey finds a magic pebble that grants his every wish, but in a moment of fright he wishes he were a rock, and then cannot hold the pebble to wish himself back to normal again.</p>
	<p>Stoeke, Janet. A Hat for Minerva Louise (PIC STOEKE)</p> <p>Minerva Louise, a snow-loving chicken, mistakes a pair of mittens for two hats to keep both ends warm.</p>
	<p>Waddell, Martin. Owl Babies (PIC WADDELL)</p> <p>Three owl babies whose mother has gone out in the night try to stay calm while she is gone</p>
	<p>Walsh, Ellen. Mouse Paint (PIC WALSH)</p> <p>Three white mice discover jars of red, blue, and yellow paint and explore the world of color.</p>
	<p>Weeks, Sarah. Overboard! (PIC WEEKS)</p> <p>From morning to night, a young child playfully grabs and throws items, including a bathtime rubber ducky and snack time raisins</p>
	<p>Wells, Rosemary. Bunny Cakes (PIC WELLS)</p> <p>Max makes an earthworm cake for Grandma's birthday and helps Ruby with her angel surprise cake. At the store, the grocer can't read all of the shopping list, until Max solves the problem by drawing a picture.</p>
	<p>Wheeler, Lisa. Dino-hockey (PIC WHEELER)</p> <p>The meat-eating dinosaurs challenge the plant-eating dinosaurs to a hockey match.</p>
	<p>Wilcox, Leah. Falling for Rapunzel (PIC WILCOX)</p> <p>A prince tries to get Rapunzel to throw down her hair so he can rescue her, but she mishears him and throws down random objects from her room instead.</p>

	<p>Williams, Mo. Edwina, the Dinosaur (PIC WILLIAMS)</p> <p>Edwina the friendly neighborhood dinosaur, friend to children and grown-ups alike, finds a foe in young Reginald Von Hoobie-Doobie, who insists that she is extinct</p>
	<p>Wood, Audrey. The Napping House (PIC WOOD)</p> <p>In this cumulative tale, a wakeful flea atop a number of sleeping creatures causes a commotion, with just one bite.</p>
	<p>Yolen, Jane. How Do Dinosaurs Eat Their food? (PIC YOLEN)</p> <p>Presents an introduction to table manners, in simple text with illustrations, explaining proper etiquette as a variety of dinosaurs display playful antics at the dinner table.</p>
	<p>Yolen, Jane. How Do Dinosaurs Get Well Soon? (PIC YOLEN)</p> <p>Describes what a young dinosaur should do in order to quickly get over being sick.</p>
	<p>Young, Rugh. Who Says Moo? (PIC YOUNG)</p> <p>Presents in rhyming text, matching sounds and descriptive clues to pictures, such as a muddy hippo, a singing frog, and other animals</p>
